Old Business	Station 3 update: Chief Bennett mentioned how they are working through the design plans for both station 3 and the training facility. Chief Gardner is working with the district PIO, Susan Lilly, to provide public information to area residence. SMPA would like to work with the district on bury power lines and it will do a review with the same time line as the remodel, so it lines up well. CDOT is also still working on the access and apron. Apparatus update: Engine 2129 was sold to Upper West Fork Volunteer fire dept in West Virginia. Chief Scott Hicks came to Telluride and picked up the apparatus to drive back home. The vehicle sold for \$78K. Capt. Mike Kimball is working with Polaris on another Wildland built side by side with expected delivery by July. The Type 3 is currently in the build phase. Mid-Term Audit: Representatives from DWC came to Telluride to finish the 2025 audit review. All was well with the current audit review. A final audit review for submission is expected for the June meeting.				
New Business	Onboarding updates: Stephannie discussed the hiring of 3 new Seasonal Wildland staff members. They have completed the hiring process, and have finished the Critical 80 for Wildland training. The new hires have been assigned a shift assignment and are ready to start normal operations. Summer weather status and predictions: Chief Bennett and Chief Cheroske attended an interagency meeting to discuss and prepare for the upcoming wildland season. Current drought conditions indicate forest fuel loads are at a critical level, which has a high probability of ignition. Creating the potential for a volatile fire season. Chief Bennett expressed appreciation to the Board for their continued support as the district maintains a hope for the best prepare for the worst stance. 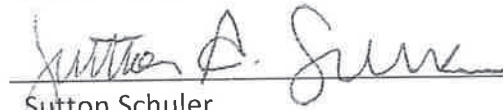

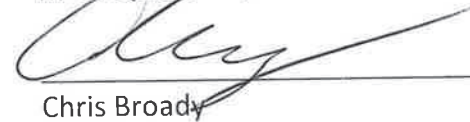
